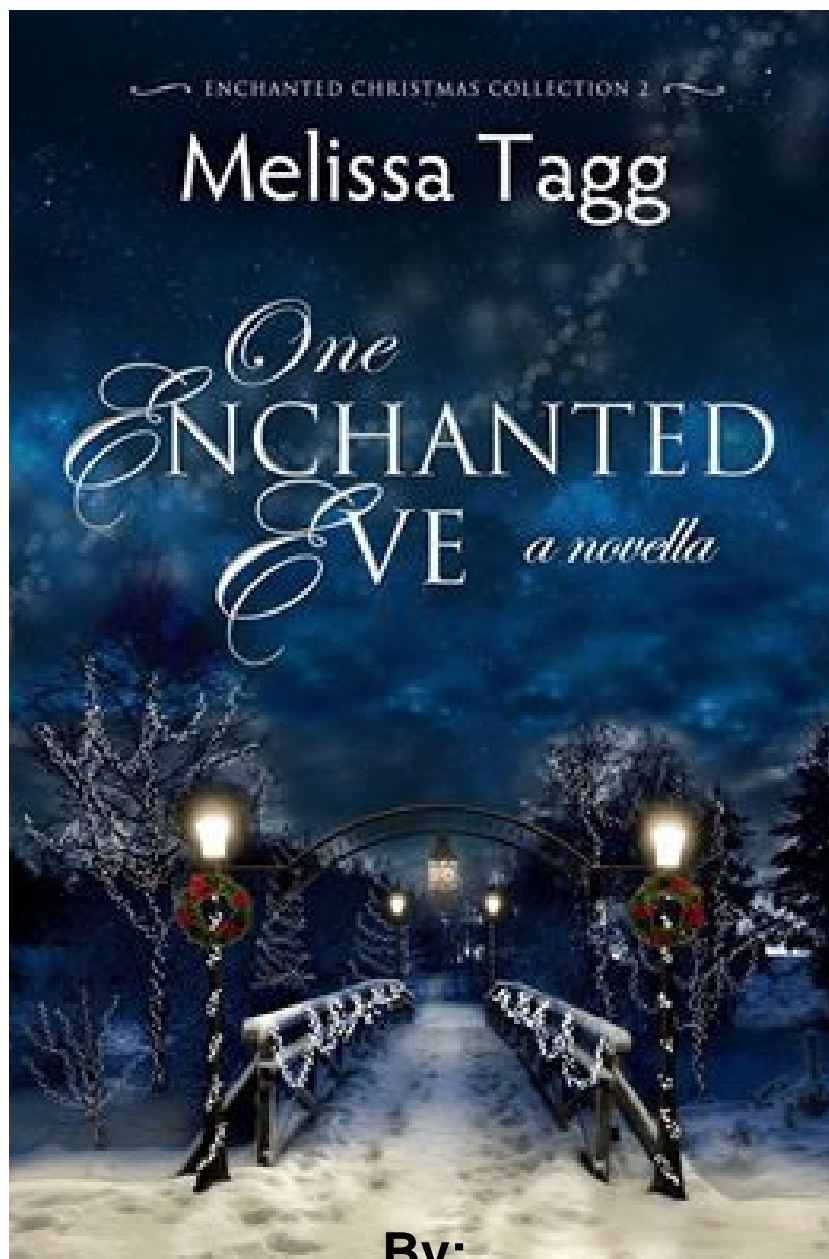

He doesn't follow the recipes, makes the most incredible messes in the kitchen and breaks everything in sight. However, Colin has a talent in the kitchen, he takes chances, follows his instincts and creates wonderful baked goods. Rylan is afraid to take a chance and follows her recipes to a 't'.

Colin is determined to prove to his family that he is not the same man he used to be; he's more stable, more responsible. If only he can get the chance to prove it to them. Rylan wants her dream to open her own bakery to become a reality and she only has to create one unique dish.

Two weeks before Christmas, Colin invites her to spend Christmas in his hometown of Maple Valley. She goes, but doesn't know why she does. Doesn't God always have a plan? He wants to give His children hope and a future. Sometimes we don't see things His way, but He still wants to the best for us.

After all, my Mum was only in her late 50s when she was diagnosed. But I have been there, just like the Renwycke family had, in all those places you don't want to go. Well done, really well done, for adding that element with care.
